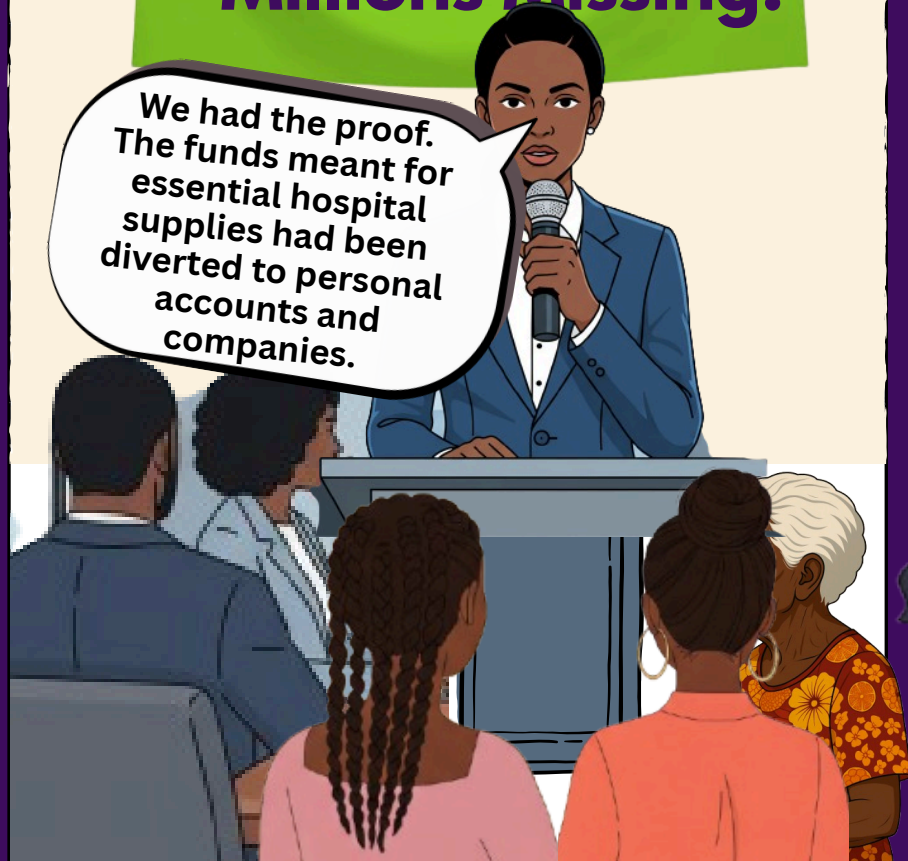

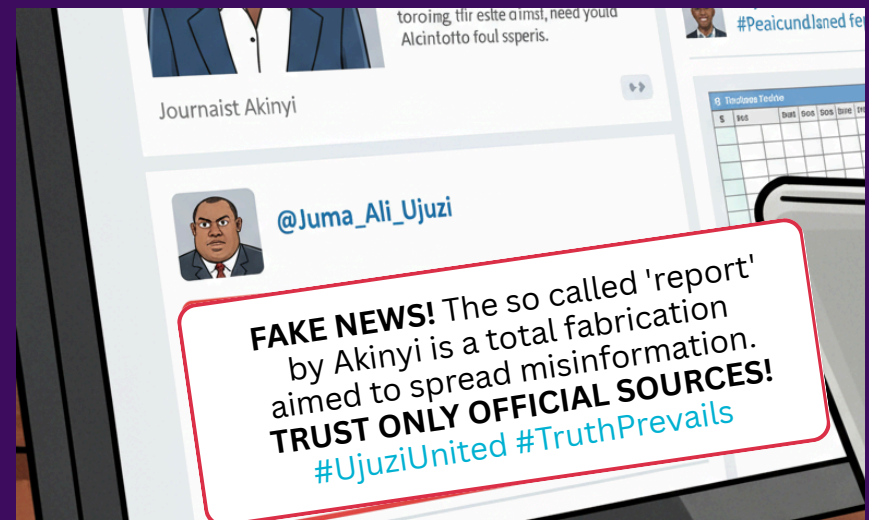
Minister Juma's Online Plot

The Calculated Counterattack

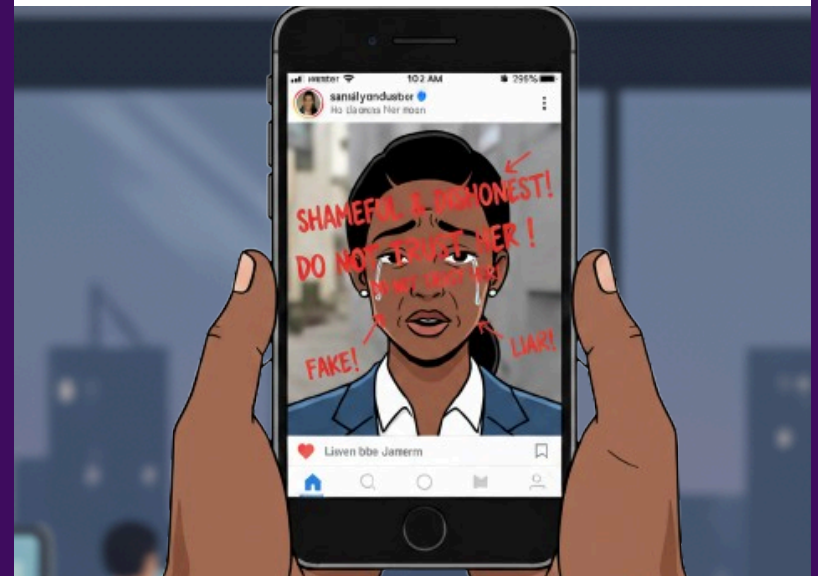


The positive comments start to be interspersed with negative ones, specifically targeting the source of the information rather than the content.

The attack wasn't random; it was calculated trolling, designed to discredit her by humiliating her.



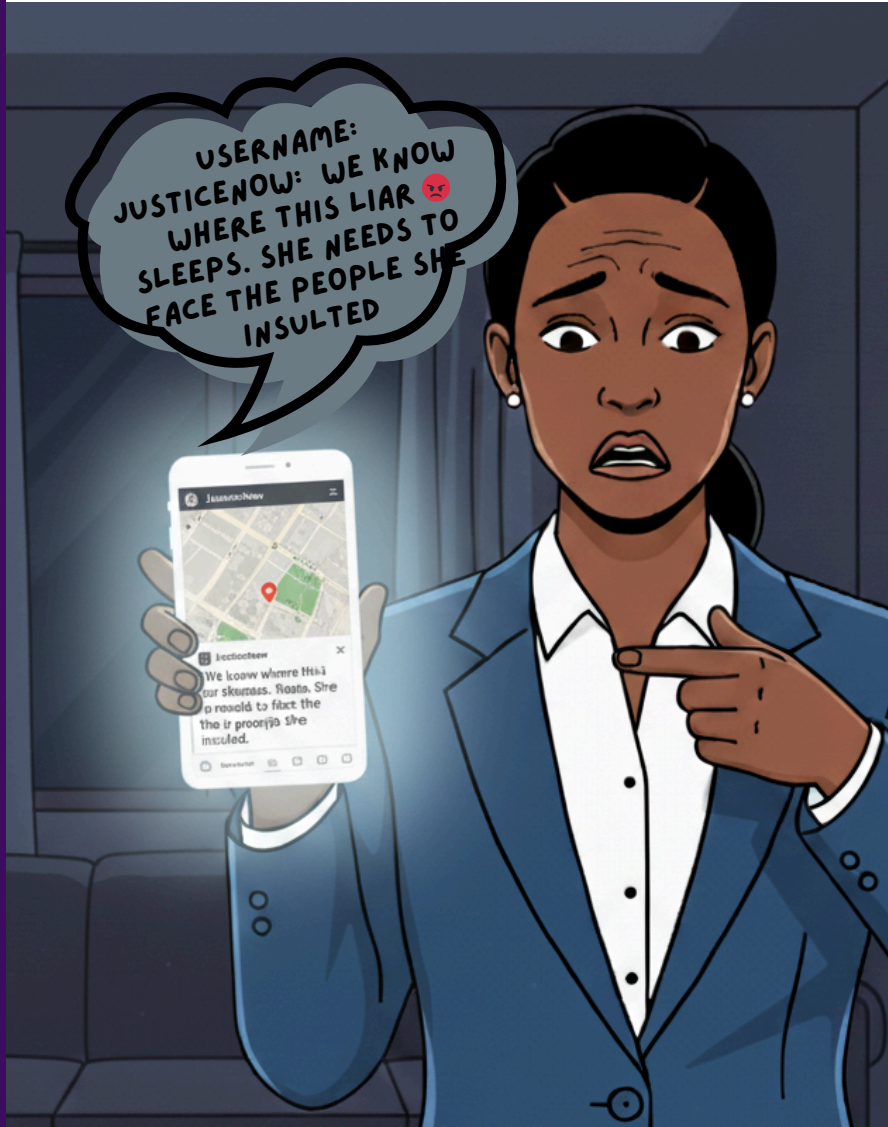
The Minister's Dark Turn

Akinyi, I saw the social media storm. It's targeted. It's not just criticism, it's TFGV.

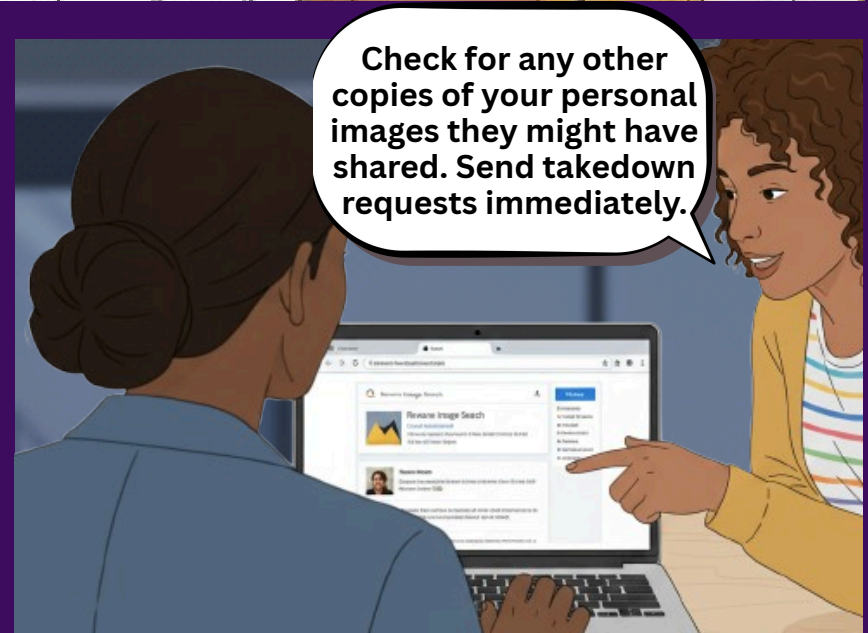
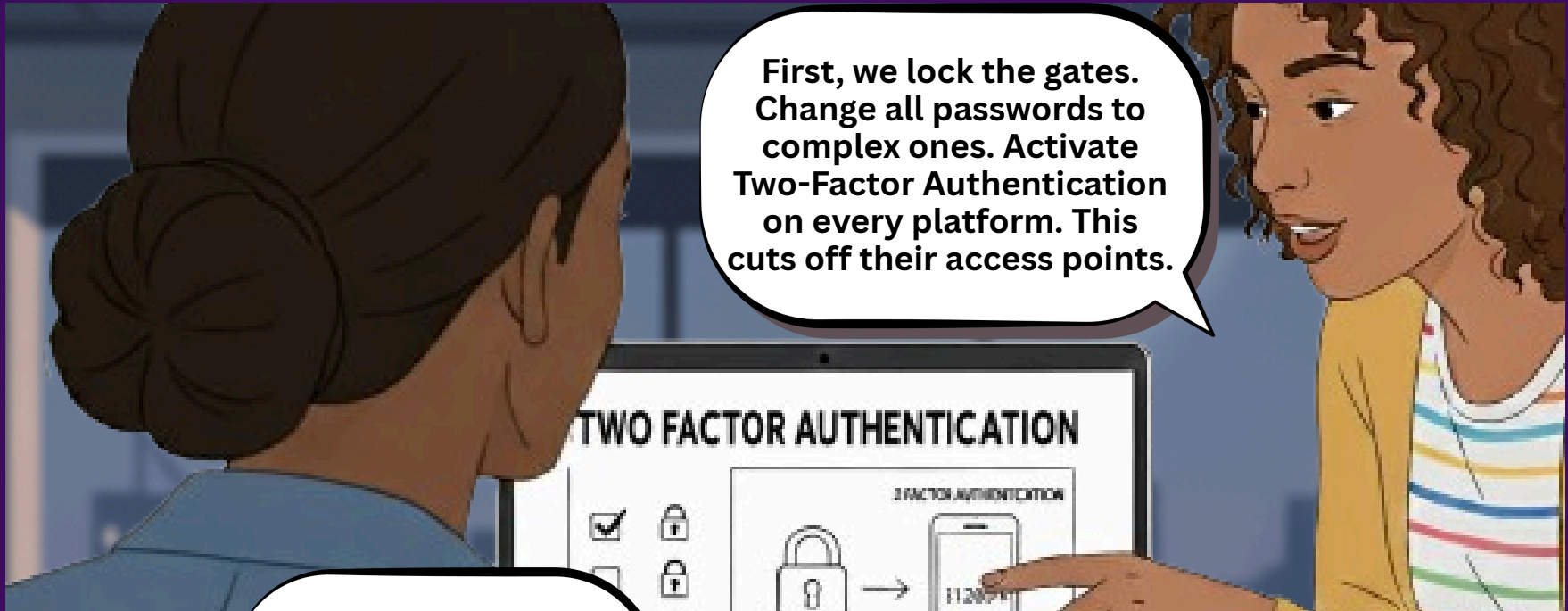


I feel completely exposed. They've gone through my personal life just to shut down a public story.



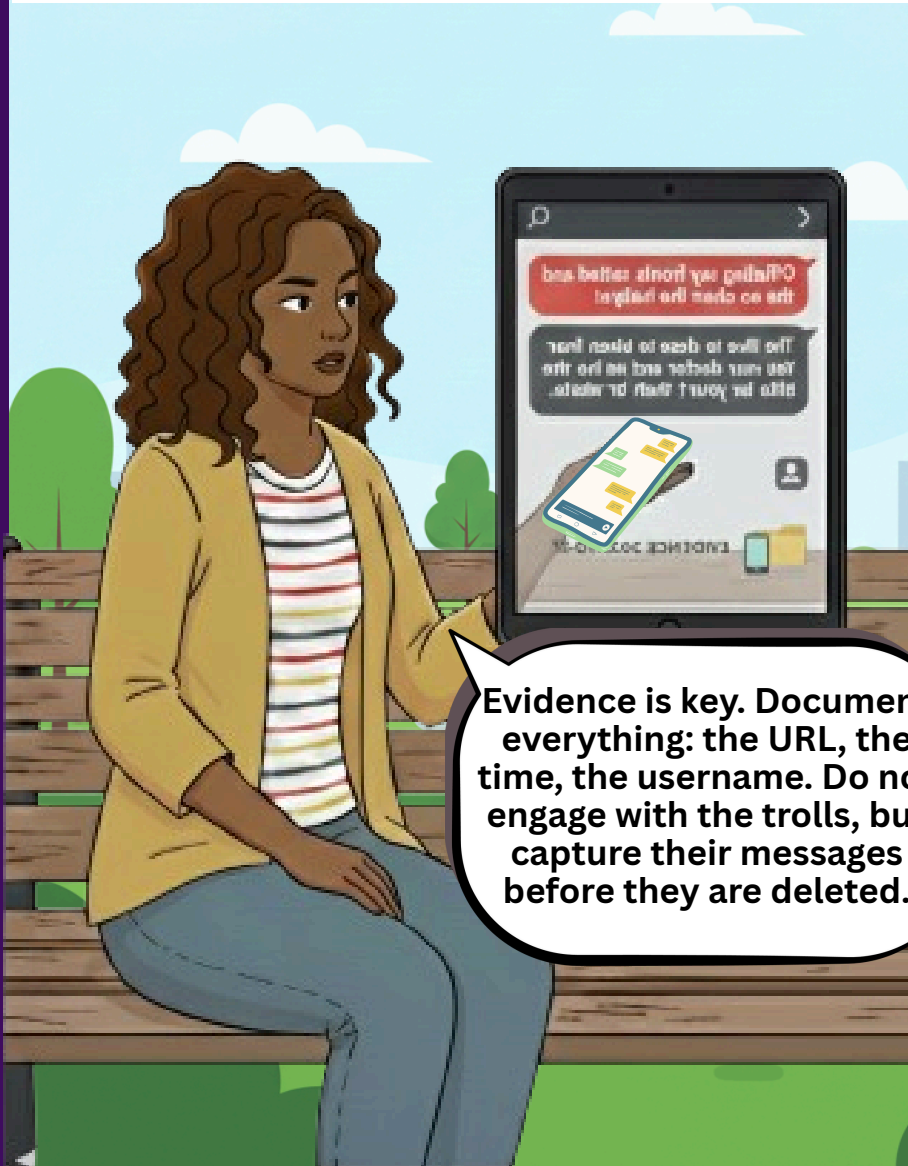
You are not to blame. This is a deliberate tactic to silence a truth-teller. But we have a defense. You are not alone; we have a network for this.

Solution 4: Mental Health and Solidarity

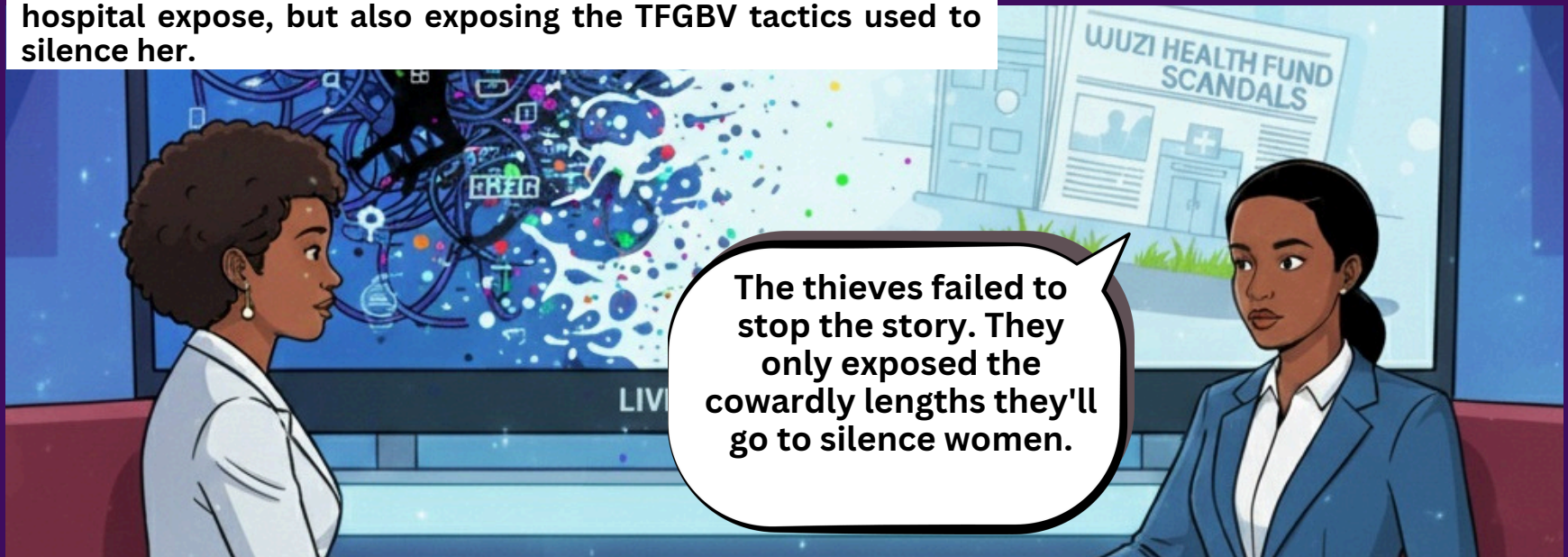


Akinyi taking a Digital Detox. turning off her phone, spending time with her grandmother in the village, for an emotional break.

Reclaiming the Narrative

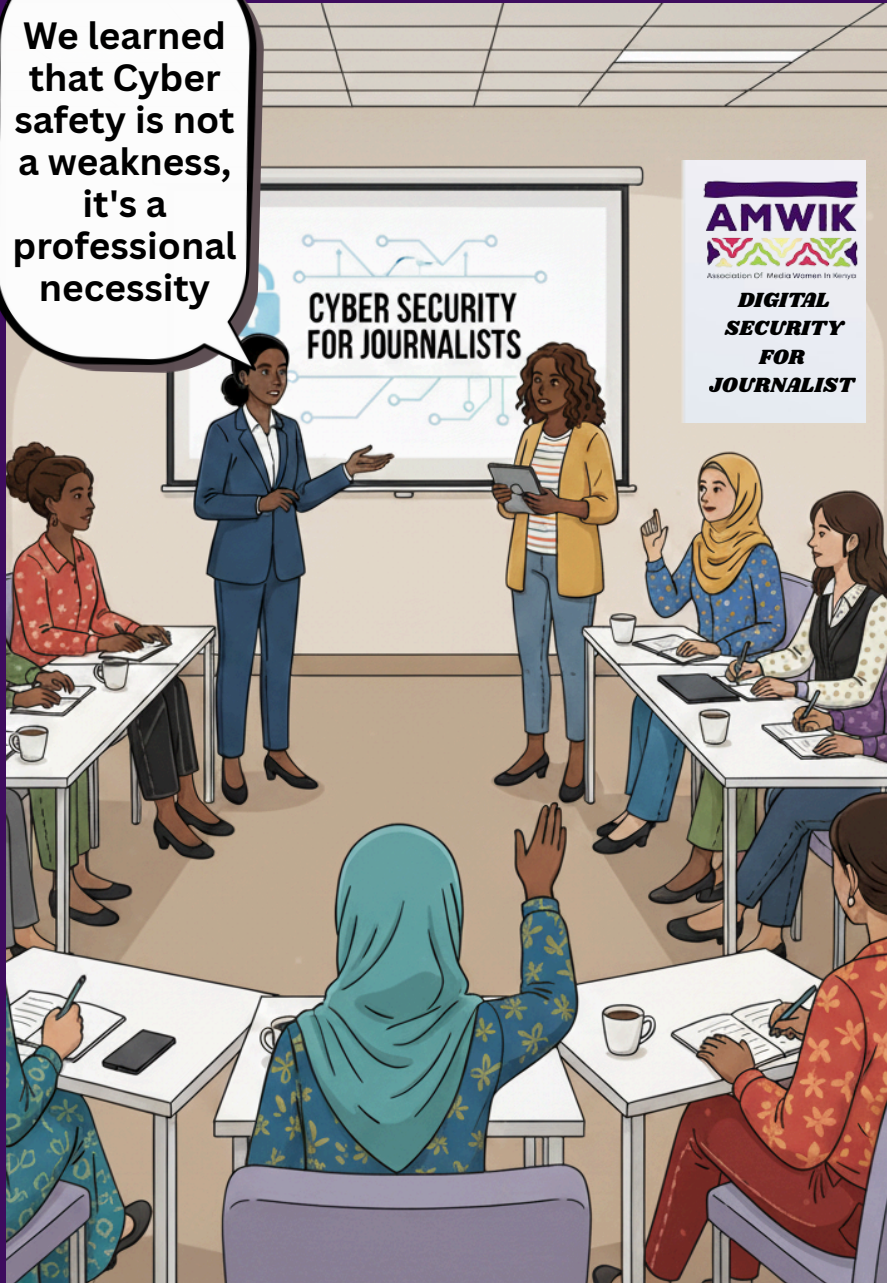


Akinyi gives an interview on a TV show, not just discussing the hospital expose, but also exposing the TFGBV tactics used to silence her.
